## 2020-21 ELECTIVE COURSE OPTIONS FOR $6^{\text {TH }}$ GRADE STUDENTS

## Apex Middle School

Elective courses are not required subject areas like reading and math, but are optional courses that may be of interest to your child. Each middle school offers unique elective courses that your child can choose to take. The elective courses listed below are options for $6^{\text {th }}$ grade students. Your child will select Band as an elective or participate in our Exploratory Path. This means that they will be assigned a four 9 week electives from the list below. | Course | Course Description |

| Beginning Band (year long) | Emphasizes the acquisition of basic musical skills. No <br> previous musical experience is required. Several musical <br> selections are performed for an audience. A few evening <br> performances should be anticipated. Students may begin <br> on flute, clarinet, trumpet or trombone, and will have an <br> opportunity to transition to other instruments, later in <br> the school year. Initially, classes are divided between <br> brass instruments |
| Exploring Social and Emotional Skills | Basic instruction on Family and Consumer Sciences <br> foundation and skills. Students explore how social and <br> emotional skills develop, and strategies to support and <br> encourage healthy social and emotional skill <br> development. |
| Computer Science Discoveries | Empowers students to create authentic artifacts and <br> engage with computer science as a way to explore <br> creativity, communication, problem solving. This course <br> inspires students as they build their own computing <br> devices. |
| Keyboarding | Students learn the touch-typing method of keyboarding <br> skills. Additionally, students learn basic <br> formatting, editing, and word processing. This course is <br> strongly recommended to learn necessary computer <br> classroom and lifelong skills. |
| Music Exploratory | Introduction to the skills necessary for singing and <br> playing music with accuracy and expression while <br> interpreting the sound and symbols of music. Through <br> the study of various genres and cultures students will <br> analyze, evaluate and understand the music and concepts <br> from other areas. |


| Exploratory Art | Introduces students to art history, elements and <br> principles of art. Projects emphasize skills \& techniques <br> through a variety of media that may include: drawing, <br> painting, printmaking, mixed media, pottery, and <br> sculpture. Application of these elements to the students' <br> own original artwork is the major emphasis. |

| Exploratory Spanish | An introduction to the Spanish language and culture. <br> Students will explore Spanish vocabulary and structures <br> in order to communicate using short, memorized <br> phrases. Topics include introductions, greetings, and <br> biographical information. This course is not included in <br> the curriculum series for high school credit. |
